2023 saw the last full calendar year of ABOVE, the Foundation's eight-part series of seasonal Night Galleries in the Samuel Oschin Planetarium. Each installment of this program featured an original presentation by Griffith Observatory Director Dr. E.C. Krupp.

The goal of this program was two-fold: Bring more people into our orbit and showcase Griffith Observatory's signature technology and storytelling. On both counts, ABOVE was a success. Every show sold out in short order with many attendees being new to Foundation programming. And the Zeiss Universarium Mark IX star projector dazzled with its fiber-optic technology and sophisticated computerization of the Sun, Moon, planets, and the most accurate, awe-inspiring star fields to be projected anywhere in the world.

The final installment of ABOVE was shown on February 26, 2024 with Night Gallery: The Stars of the Zodiac. Stay tuned for more great original programming from Griffith Observatory Foundation in the future.


COMMUNITY IMPACT

With support from Griffith Observatory Foundation, the Observatory is reaching people in more ways than ever before–from dual school programs, special programs, and broadcasts to social media, newsletters, and off-the-hill outreach.

119,200 -plus visitors looked through the historic Zeiss telescope this year, further securing its legacy as the most-looked-through telescope in the world.

1,517,725 people visited Griffith Observatory in 2023, which is 668,594 more visitors than 2022, propeling visitorship back to prepandemic levels.

The Foundation supports technology upgrades and innovation, outreach, and resources that make it possible. Our community engagement this year included partnerships with City of STEM, LA2050, Yuri's Night, LA Conservancy, Lazy Acres, Los Angeles Astronomical Society, Safe Place for Space, UCLA, the Library Foundation of Los Angeles, and others.
