CONNECTING THE WORLD TO THE GREAT NORTH AMERICAN ECLIPSE...



As part of our public service commitment, the Observatory and the Foundation provided resources to help people near and far make the most of observing the total solar eclipse with a <u>live broadcast from the path of totality</u>, tips for safe viewing, and <u>classroom content for educators</u>.

Thanks to Foundation support, Griffith Observatory's broadcast team now has the capacity to stream more events from the field such as the September, 2024, major lunar standstill from Chimney Rock, Colorado.

RENOVATED SPACE... FOR SPACE

Griffith Observatory Foundation is dedicated to preserving and enhancing the iconic theaters and exhibits to ensure Griffith Observatory remains a shining landmark for all to experience!

In 2024, funds from Foundation members, supporters, and partners helped ensure the Leonard Nimoy Event Horizon theater would live long and prosper. The theater closed for a six weeks to undergo a technical renovation, which included a full upgrade to the theater's sound system to meet industry standards and deliver a premier sonic experience. The existing system was replaced with Dolby Atmos for a fully immersive sound environment in the iconic venue.

WORK IN PROGRESS









The theater projection system was upgraded from high-definition to 4K, and the projector screen was replaced with one that is darker in reflectance so that projected images appear richer with more dynamic range and more vibrant colors.

SPARKING COSMIC CURIOSITY


Griffith Observatory has been delivering quality educational programming since opening its doors in 1935. In 2024, the school programs are immersive STEM learning experiences that align with Next Generation Science Standards. Fully funded by Griffith Observatory Foundation, these programs are entirely free to participants, and bus scholarships are available for Title I schools.

Today, School Programs are offered both in person and online, creating nearly limitless opportunities for student learning. With barriers like the cost of transportation and geography out of the way, hundreds of thousands of students can be served.

At the end of the 2023-2024 academic year, <u>Griffith Observatory's School Programs were featured on LA Times Today</u>, a recurring segment on Spectrum 1 News that highlights community programs having meaningful local impact.



ART & SCIENCE COLLIDE



Pacific Standard Universe is an original short film by Griffith Observatory and a program of PST ART: Art & Science Collide, the Getty's landmark regional event exploring the intersections of art and science. The film shows the way people used art to explain the cosmos for thousands of years until the modern universe was discovered in Southern California.

The film premiered on September 9, 2024, alongside two panel discussions: one with the production's Chumash cultural advisors and voice talent Manuel "Bo" Armenta and Rex Saint-Onge, Sr. as well as Griffith Observatory Director Dr. E.C. Krupp and other PST ART participants including UCLA Professor Dr. Victoria Vesna and LACMA Curator Dr. Stephen Little. The program was moderated by Foundation Board Secretary Tricia Nelson and was an illuminating conversation on the intersection of art and science.

The film <u>now plays</u> daily in the Leonard Nimoy Event Horizon theater. The film is a project of PST ART with additional support from Griffith Observatory Foundation.



ADVOCACY FOR PUBLIC ASTRONOMY & OUR PARKS

The City budget proposed in April, 2024, included significant personnel and funding cuts for the Department of Recreation and Parks (RAP), which owns and operates Griffith Observatory. The elimination of a crucial Observatory position was included in those proposed cuts.

Many Foundation supporters contacted Los Angeles City Council members and submitted public comments. Our message was clear: Communities need safe, clean, well-maintained recreation and park facilities, and that includes Griffith Observatory.

Thanks to Foundation advocacy, the City Council modified the proposed budget to reduce some of the impacts on RAP and to restore the Observatory position proposed for deletion. Unfortunately, the final, approved City budget (which took effect on July 1) still included the loss of hundreds of full-time RAP positions and a reduction in RAP's part-time staff budget.

As public resources, Griffith Observatory and Los Angeles City parks will always require the advocacy of its supporters. The Foundation community answered this time, and will surely be called upon again in the future to ensure these beloved places and spaces are secure for generations to come.

In 2024, the Foundation opened a very special seat dedication opportunity in the Samuel Oschin Planetarium. These dedications have been etched in the cosmic landscape at Griffith Observatory. The Samuel Oschin Planetarium operates 10-12 hours per day, six days a week, and each year it serves 27,000 fifth-graders who attend our free In-Person School Program and captivates another 400,000 visitors from across the region and around the world to see our shows each year.


